From the Desk of Rabbi Stillerman

We are terribly saddened and pained by the attack at Chabad of Poway, CA on the last day of Passover during the Yizkor memorial service. It is at a time when many Jews gather in Synagogue to commemorate their loved ones and memorialize their lives. The irony is thick when at a time of celebrating a loving and peaceful life of beautiful memories, members faced a senseless and baseless assault from a terrorist believing Jewish continuity should be nonexistent.



Whether it is an attack in a synagogue in Pittsburg or in a Chabad Center in Southern California proves that this is an attack against us all, as we grieve the loss of Lori Gilbert Kaye and pray for the wellbeing of the injured, Rabbi Yisroel Goldstein, Mr. Alon Peretz, and Noya Dahan with healing and comfort to the entire Jewish community.

The Chabad Rebbe strongly encouraged responding to times of distress with acts of goodness and kindness. It is no longer enough to think about these atrocities or speak about them; it is time for a change, namely action. We must fight darkness with light. Please consider doing a Mitzvah, an act of kindness to show positive change, a resolve of strength against adversity.

"We sat at the Passover Seder singing the V'hi Sheamda stating that in every generation they rise against us and yet G-d saves us from their hands. We need to stand in solidarity as we see these words ring true in our time. We will prevail." This message was spoken by Rabbi Goldstein at a press conference today and on Shabbat when he was injured as he stayed close to his congregation standing in shock and addressed them, comforting them by saying these words.

At this time, we want to assure you that we are taking immediate measures to continue to ensure our facility is safe and secure with the assistance from the Orange County Sheriff and Chabad Security commission. We want to thank all those who reached out and checked in on us showing their care and support, specifically our local law enforcement, community members and residents.

From the President

Over the past several months our Chabad lost two pillars of our congregation, Gerry Boxstein in late December and Phil Silverman in late March.

I first met these two men at Beth Torah Synagogue in Laguna Woods prior to its merging with Chabad. For me it was a "test" shabbat – I wanted to see if the two shuls could find enough common ground to warrant a merger and could the two sets of congregants get along with our different prayer books, tunes, order of prayers, and not to mention, different personalities. I was called up to the Torah where both Gerry and Phil stood aiding the Rabbi in



the davening. Both men were arguing with each other. Loudly. I did not understand the source of their conflict, but the tension was real and you could cut it with a knife!

I don't recount this story out of any disrespect to the memories of Gerry and Phil – just the opposite.

Both men revered and loved the Torah to a degree that was personal. A wrong word or a "should when we shouldn't have" was as if the slight was against him personally. I never experienced that before and it was something to witness.

Gerry knew and respected tradition and was adamant in all of us abiding by it. He knew how things were to be done, said and performed and if we strayed one iota, he let the Rabbi and all of us know. His bark was truly worse than his bite, however. He often gave me advice that came from the heart and just below his gruff demeanor, Gerry was a complete softy. When he smiled or gave an encouraging word, you knew that you had done right.

Phil on the other hand, exuded love. No less a stickler for tradition and how services should be conducted, Phil wore his Torah on his sleeve – that is to say, his love of prayer, study, singing, music and teaching of Torah and Judaism shined through like an actual light. He had such joy in all things Judaism that it was absolutely contagious. You wanted to be like Phil when you grew up!

When one talks of another making a house a home, we know that it means the structure and its environment are a more permanent, safe, loving, warm, and welcoming place. I often thought that both men meant the same for me for Chabad. They made two separate Jewish communities in Beth Torah and Chabad a shul – a home.

Both Gerry's and Phil's respective families and friends are mourning their loss. As a community we deeply mourn their loss as well. G-d broke the molds when he made those two very unique and yet very similar individuals. I joked that when Gerry welcomed Phil to Heaven, he was beaming because not only did he get there first, he could proudly show Phil how things were done up there.

It is true that as a congregation we have big shoes to fill. We do so humbly and with gratitude that we got to spend so much quality time learning from both Gerry Boxstein and Phil Silverman. They left a tremendous impression on so many. May their memories be a blessing for us all.

Wednesday, May 8, 15, 22, 29 – **Jewish Learning Institute Presents: Wrestling with Faith** Most people, even the devout, struggle with beliefs about G-d. It is easy, for example, to affirm the basic tenets of Judaism during a prayer service, but when it comes to trusting G-d with our daily decisions, many share a secret, painful fear that G-



d isn't really looking out for them. Many of us have been brought up under the assumption that mainstream science is incompatible with our Jewish faith. So when we see compelling evidence for biological evolution, for example, we feel forced to choose between science and our faith. Wrestling with Faith was created to tackle questions like these—the "Big Issues" that keep people from an intimate relationship with G-d. The course acknowledges the often-unspoken doubts and fears that all people share, and seizes their invitation for us to dig deeper for the answers. 
